# World Health Organization

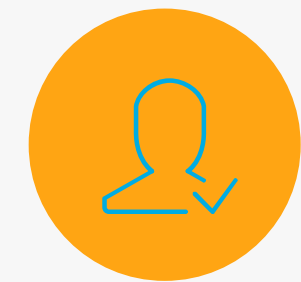
*WHO's primary role is to direct international health within the United Nations' system and to lead partners in global health responses.*

Assessment:  
written test based on job itself, technical questions
