Branishka Lewis is a Public Health Professional with experience in both the public, NGO and private sectors. Branishka graduated from the University of London in 2016 with a MSc in Public Health and has experience working in the Bahamas and Sub-Saharan Africa.

In terms of AIDS/HIV, her areas of expertise include: report writing, counselling, and prevention-of-mother-to-child-transmission (PMTCT of HIV); for 15 years, she worked with the Bahamas Ministry of Health, three of those years as the Acting Director of its National AIDS/HIV Centre, and for 11 years, she was a nurse, with an emphasis on AIDS/HIV care. She was a fellow with the HealthCorp with the Centre for Infectious Diseases Research in Zambia, focusing on AIDS/HIV in women and children. Currently, she's focusing on the COVID-19 pandemic working with the Royal Caribbean Group.
