Preparing for the Online Careers Fair



- Go to the Careers Moodle page
- Click on the <u>Online Careers Fair</u> tab
- We asked employers questions when they signed up
 - The organisation and its work;
 - The experience/qualifications they typically look for in applicants;
 - Particular student groups their roles are likely to be of interest to (eg particular MSc programmes, diploma programmes, RD students);
 - Typical job roles at that organisation;
 - Whether they are currently recruiting;
 - Where is the world roles are typically located;
 - Whether they sponsor visas/organise work permits where applicable.

Typical job roles:	Epidemiologist Statistician

Research



- Research the organisations that you are interested in
- Use the <u>Employer Information Jan 2024</u> tab
- Also use organisation websites, careers pages, organisation page on LinkedIn

What to ask employers



- Create a list of questions that you want to ask them...
- For example:
 - O What does a typical day look like?
 - O How do you find the company culture?

 - O What is challenging about the job?
 - What are the top 3 skills you are looking for?

Prioritise



- Create a list of organisations you want to speak with
- Put them in priority order
- Visit them in priority order
- That way, you won't miss out on conversations with your favourites!

Take Notes



- Take notes of anything that is interesting and useful during the session
- Save any links that are shared by the employers in the chat

Reflect



- Take the time in-between visiting employers to reflect on what you are learning, what questions work well/not so well, where you want to head next, and what you want to ask and gain from the interaction
- There will be LSHTM Careers Consultants in the main room, who can assist you on the day with thoughts, reflections, questions
