The UK Public Health landscape



- National picture central Government, <u>UK Health</u> <u>Security Agency</u> and <u>Office for Health Improvement</u> <u>and Disparities</u>), NICE.
- Implementation local authorities (also charities/NGOs).
- Other major players Think Tanks, consultancies, pharma;
- Research universities, pharma, research aspects in other organisations/roles.
- Public Health training scheme/registrar training, leading to Public Health Consultant role (usually via local authority).



One of the medical specialties, but open to non-medics;

- Varied training over 4-5 years (4 years if already hold PH master's);
- Mandatory placements: 12 months Local Authority; 4 months in Health Protection;

Optional placements;

Options for 'Out of Programme' experience (or research e.g. PhD);

Two exams – written and practical/scenario based;

Potential route to higher level jobs.



Faculty of Public Health Specialty Training

Body responsible for the training.

60-90 places per year.

Visit website to check for 2023 application opening and closing dates (open window is circa 1 month).

Assessment centre - usually held in the January.

Selection events – late Feb to early March (virtual).

Do you have to be from the UK? No but...

"Applicants must be eligible to work in the UK" (<u>Public Health ST1, Essential Entry</u> <u>Criteria</u>)



One of the most competitive specialties for medics. Competition varies by location but overall, 8 (98:786 competition ratio*). <u>Data on last year here</u>

- London and Southeast 18 (15:266), previously 14 (17:234)
- Scotland 6 (11:62), previously 11 (5:53)
- Wales 9 (3:26), previously 13 (2:26)

So it varies, but London/South East is particularly competitive.

*Ratio (posts available: eligible 1st choice apps)

I'm not a doctor



- Experience required, including public health experience
- No precise description of what that is
- Up to you to evidence & demonstrate
- "At least 48 months' whole-time equivalent (wte) work experience by application closing date, of which at least 24 months (wte) must be in an area relevant to population health practice" (Public Health ST1)





Application and assessment of eligibility – first stage; After that, all 'blind' selection (no difference for medics/non-medics).

Assessment centre – verbal/numerical reasoning, situational judgement; Selection centre – group task, individual interview, written assessment.

All candidates ranked, candidates then also rank areas (in UK) in order of preference.

Training organized regionally, once on scheme, stay in that region.

9 & 10 January 2024	Assessment centre
to be confirmed	Notification of assessment centre outcome
27 February - 29 February 2024	Selection event (virtual)
By 5pm 26 March 2024	First offers will be made via NHS England - East Midlands. Offers will be made in meritocratic order with highest ranked candidates receiving first preference until all available posts are filled.
