Alongside our lunchtime workshop on Getting into Management Consultancy, you might be interested in a complementary event: the **UCL Management Consultancy Careers Fair**. Taking place on Wednesday 1st October 16.00-19.00 (On Campus at UCL, IOE Building), the Management Consultancy Careers Fair is aimed at students from all degree disciplines. The UCL Management Consultancy Careers Fair features some of the top employers from a wide variety of consultancy sectors including strategy, financial, brand, technology and HR. This industry-specific fair brings together a number of different recruiters at the same time who are all looking to hire students and graduates from UCL and partner institutions. It's a great opportunity to speak to managers, recruitment personnel and/or recent graduate hires to find out about current opportunities, get inside information on hiring and selection processes for the companies you're interested in and expand your professional networks as well as being a general chance to ask any other questions you

may have. A broad range of employers attend these fairs, from international organisations to small and medium sized businesses, including those with health or data science sections in their portfolio, so you can really compare what everyone has to offer.

Booking A One-To-One Appointment

Following Welcome Week, our appointments tend to book up quickly in Term 1. Do keep checking for available appointments in the future. Appointments last 30 minutes and can be as specific or general as you like. You can explore ideas, discuss job search and application tactics, review an application you are working on, or do a practice interview. You can even come along with no specific question but just an intention to start your career planning now. Check your CV and Cover Letter with CareerSet

CareerSet enables you to check, score, and improve your CV and Cover Letter using their AI-powered platform. You can 'Score my CV' to receive actionable feedback on your CV; 'Target my CV' to tailor your CV to a specific role; and 'Review my cover letter' to optimise and personalise your cover letter. **You can access and use the platform via this link:**

Migrant Leaders

After 23 years in GE, News Corp and EY, Elham Fardad launched the charity Migrant Leaders in 2017. The aim of their professional development programme is to support young 1st and 2nd generation migrants as well as all disadvantaged youths and to help them succeed in Britain. The programme is free and applicants are between 16 and 25 years old and they gain mentoring, workshops, work experiences and connections.

Fully Funded MRes and PhD Training Programme in Interdisciplinary Health Science

Imperial will recruit another cohort of MRes/PhD students for its fully funded Doctoral Training Partnership (DTP) commencing October 2026. [MultiSci](#) is a 4.5 year DTP in Interdisciplinary Health Science generously funded by the [Medical Research Council \(MRC\)](#). Imperial will open applications for 2026 entry on 7 October 2025. MultiSci's [research themes](#) are: the battle against infections, understanding disease mechanisms in humans, and realising the power of big data to improve health. MultiSci students also benefit from professional development training opportunities and cohort activities.
