## Book Your 1-to-1 Appointment with a Careers Consultant

You have access to 1-to-1 appointments with a careers consultant during your programme, and for up to 2 years after you graduate. In these 30-minute appointments, we can cover anything that you are working on in your career development - for example career planning, decision making, networking, LinkedIn, job search, CV, cover letter, application support, interview practice, or a mixture of topics. Appointments are available in-person (Mondays, Thursdays) and online (Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays). For in-person appointments, the careers service is located in the Student Support Services, Education Centre, 2nd Floor, 15-17 Tavistock Place (TP1), WC1H 9SH. Please note that this is approximately 15-minute walk between TP1 and Keppel Street, so do factor this into your timings. If you want to change an in-person appointment to an online appointment please email [careers@lshtm.ac.uk](mailto:careers@lshtm.ac.uk) in advance and we can usually accommodate you. If you want to do a CV or cover letter review, please run your CV through [CareerSet here](#) first before booking an appointment, after which we are happy to also do an in-person CV or cover letter review. ## Check your CV and Cover Letter with CareerSet

CareerSet enables you to check, score, and improve your CV and Cover Letter using their AI-powered platform. You can 'Score my CV' to receive actionable feedback on your CV; 'Target my CV' to tailor your CV to a specific role; and 'Review my cover letter' to optimise and personalise your cover letter. **You can access and use the platform via this link:** <https://careerset.com/lshtm> This link logs you in for one session, and your account is created upon your first login, where you can read and accept the terms and privacy policy. You also have access as a graduate - you can sign up to CareerSet with your personal or alumni email address by clicking on the 'alumni sign up' and entering the code **LSHTMGRAD**.
